FROM HOME GROWN TO THIRD PARTY

- Current reporting system functioned to keep us afloat during the accreditation crisis
 - File repository with limited functions
- We are outgrowing it
 - System maintenance
 - Outcome mapping, assessment tracking, action planning,
 - Integration with curriculum (and eventually, program review)

ACCREDITATION

- **Standard II.A.16: Instructional Programs**

- Recommendation 4: *“enhance the depth and availability of overall documentation of dialog about student learning and institutional planning ... demonstrate implementation of improvement plans across courses, programs, and service learning outcomes.”*

- **Standard II. C.2: Student Support Services**

- Recommendation 6: *“establish a more structured timeline for each learning outcome ... use data to evaluate the effectiveness of strategy and its contribution to the success and learning of its students”*

- eLumen may allow us to accomplish these goals meaningfully with greater flexibility and ease,

ELUMEN

- The eLumen Assessment Module exists within an integrated ecosystem that includes
 - Curriculum and Catalog Management
 - Strategic Planning
 - Student Engagement with Assessment

FEATURES OF THE ASSESSMENT MODULE

- Assessment Data Collection for Academic and Co-Curricular Programs
- Integrated Assessment Planning for Continuous Improvement
- Integrated Curriculum and Assessment
- Intervention and Retention: Student Engagement & Directed Learning
- LMS Integration

STRUCTURE

- Organizations – Tailored to Co-curricular divisions
 - Divisions
 - Departments
 - Disciplines/Areas
 - Courses/Contexts
 - Sections/Settings
- Roles
 - Data Steward
 - Division (and Course/Area) Coordinators
 - Evaluators

ASSESSMENT

- In eLumen, an “assessment” is both:
 - A template that determines which SLOs are assessed, the scale that is used, and the performance measures for each scale level
 - And, the generic process of collecting outcome attainment data
- Assessments do not determine the activity the faculty member uses in the classroom to collect outcome data
- Two methods of data input
 - Individual student scorecard & rubric
 - Collective student score entry

OPTIONS

- Assessments can be
 - Faculty generated (“Add Assessment”)
 - Division coordinator generated (“Find Assessment”)
 - Individualized – privately owned
 - Shared (through the Assessment Library) and recommended

REFLECTIONS AND ACTION PLANS

- “Reflections” -- used to gather faculty’s evaluation of their assessment scoring data
 - Templates included *within* individual assessments
 - Linked to assessment results
- “Action Plans” -- used to organize and document the *improvement actions* that arise from departmental dialogue about assessment results or from program/institutional initiatives
 - Planned separately from individual assessments
 - Linked to resource requests
- Both are ways for the institution to collect faculty dialogue in response to assessment results

ASSESSMENT PROCESS

- Division Coordinators are responsible for planning course and program level assessment and coordinating dialogue
 - eLumen has a planning tool notify division faculty of which CLOs to assess
- Faculty then conduct an assessment activity/method of evaluation and collect outcome data
- Upon login, faculty see course sections needing assessment
 - Conduct Assessment Activity
 - Enter (or upload) assessment scores (LMS integration option...)
 - Record reflection in the provided template
 - Meet with other department colleagues and division coordinators to discuss
- Create an Action Plan – facilitated by Division Coordinator
