

## 2022 – 2023 Cost of Attendance (Budget/Expenses)

The expenses listed below are estimated costs for attending College of the Redwoods & are intended to provide a general idea about cost & help determine your financial aid awards. Actual expenses will differ from student to student based on student choice, including enrollment.

**Financial aid rarely covers all costs; student should expect to pay a portion out of pocket. Money is needed up front to pay for books/supplies etc., even with financial aid. All financial aid goes toward balances owed to CR (tuition/fees, housing, etc.) first. No funds are refunded to students unless all money owed to CR is paid in full.**

All cells highlighted in blue are variable costs depending on STUDENT choice. Costs for books, supplies, food, housing (other than on campus), transportation, & personal are all approximate & change based on student choice such as buying/renting text books, living with roommates, etc..

**Fees for ALL students are based on enrollment at 15 units per semester at \$46 per unit, plus semester fees** (\$21 health fee, \$10 ASCR/student fee, \$10 technology fee, \$2.00 student representation fee). 30 units per year x \$46 per unit + \$86 = \$1,466. **If you enroll in more or less than 15 units per semester, your costs will be different.**

**\*\*Both non-residents & OR Exchange students pay fees (\$1,466 per year depending on enrollment) & pay an additional amount as shown below:**

- **Non-resident tuition** is based on full-time enrollment at **\$333** per unit (30 units per year x \$333 per unit = \$9,990). If you enroll in more or less than 15 units per semester, your costs will be different.
- **Approved Oregon (OR) Exchange tuition** is based on full-time enrollment at **\$90** per unit (30 units per year x \$90 per unit = \$2,700) rather than the non-resident fees. If you enroll in more or less than 15 units per semester, your costs will be different.

**Food and Housing includes a portion dedicated to food costs and another portion for housing costs.** The With Parent budget estimate does not differentiate between housing and food cost. The On campus budget estimate includes fixed and variable costs totaling \$10,377. Of this amount, \$4,644 is allocated for housing cost and \$3,933 for the meal plan- these are fixed costs. An additional \$1,800 for food is included, variable cost, to account for a total of \$5,733 in total food cost. The Off campus budget estimate is \$17,784. Of this amount, \$12,051 is allocated for housing cost and \$5,733 for food.

**The Cost of Attendance (COA) above reflects the cost of one academic year, Fall and Spring semester.** Expected Family Contribution (EFC) is calculated using information provided on the FAFSA or CADAA. Most financial aid awards are based on Financial Need, the difference between COA & EFC. In most cases, awards cannot exceed Financial Need. Additionally, students do not usually receive financial aid equal to Financial Need.

*Note: The costs listed above for fees, non-resident/OR exchange tuition, & residence halls are subject to change without notice. The non-resident & Oregon exchange fees include a per unit capital outlay fee.*
